THE PROVENANCE

New York Theatre Workshop strives to be both an active producing theatre, engaging in an ongoing conversation with our audiences, and a nurturing workshop, providing off-stage support to a diverse community of artists. Our workshop activities are designed to provide artists a space to experiment and are not open to the public. However, the development of the work we share with our audiences is an important part of the conversation around each production. To that end, we include information on the piece's provenance, or beginnings, in our programs.

Following the success of their collaboration on Company, director and producer Hal Prince reunited with composer Stephen Sondheim and playwright George Furth to adapt George S. Kaufman & Moss Hart's 1934 play, Merrily We Roll Along. Updating the time period and centering on composer Franklin Shepard, Merrily We Roll Along premiered on Broadway in 1981, becoming a beloved favorite of Sondheim devotees.

Director Maria Friedman first encountered Merrily We Roll Along when she was cast as Mary at the Haymarket Theatre in Leicester, UK in 1992 (having first taken on Sondheim's work as Dot in Sunday in the Park with George in 1990). In 2010, Maria directed a student production of Merrily at London's Central School of Speech and Drama. Producer Sonia Friedman and David Babani, Artistic Director of the Menier Chocolate Factory, saw that production and David invited Maria to direct the piece at the Menier in 2012. That production was imagined with production designer Soutra Gilmour, choreographer Tim Jackson and music director Catherine Jayes.

Following its run at the Menier Chocolate Factory, Maria's production played to great acclaim in the West End, Tokyo and Boston. Former NYTW Artistic Director James C. Nicola, a longtime lover of Merrily, saw the production at The Huntington Theatre, and began conversations with Sonia and David about bringing Maria's production to New York, with the blessings of Sondheim.

Joining Maria and her collaborators are music director Alvin Hough, Jr., lighting designer Amith Chandrashaker, sound designer Kai Harada and a fantastic new company of 22 performers who bring this production to life on East 4th Street, just blocks from where Franklin, Mary and Charley perform their revue in 1960.




